

## **Position: English language editor, United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research**

### ***Description of responsibilities***

Working under the supervision of the Publications Manager, the editor will have the following responsibilities:

1. Overall responsibility for copy-editing manuscripts in accordance with UNIDIR's house style
2. Verifying references
3. Liaising with authors to resolve queries
4. Formatting texts in preparation for layout
5. Proofreading
6. Writing summaries and selecting keywords
7. Rewriting text or drafting as necessary
8. Participating in the work of the Institute as requested

### ***Qualifications required***

University degree, preferably in international relations, political science or related field  
Minimum five years of experience in editing and proofreading  
Excellent knowledge of English grammar  
Proven written communication skills  
Good working knowledge of French desirable  
Other relevant skills include: attention to detail; ability to work independently; good organizational skills; and strong commitment to deadlines.

### ***Terms***

The editor will work full-time at the Institute, located at the Palais des Nations in Geneva, Switzerland.

Salary: CHF 7,900 per month (the Institute is not responsible for medical insurance, pension, or travel expenses).

Starting date: as soon as possible

The duration of appointment shall be for an initial period of 6 months with the possibility of extension.
